n the last newsletter I wrote: "There are enough wars and conflicts in our society. Who really strives for peace and unity? "An external force, IS, has now gotten closer. It was expected, for some time, that terrorists would not spare Germany. And this is now a reality. Even now, not only are major cities targeted, we have moved closer to terror. Würzburg, for me, is in a sense "around the corner." We do our main shopping there and, as a lovely city, I take many Japanese guests there. In recent times, I often go to the university library and sit in the reading room for hours, amongst many young students. Although I do not go by the regional train to and from Würzburg (where the attack took place), sometimes it occurs to me: "What can one do if a terrorist enters the library hall with terrorist intent? There is no access control at the entrance. If there is a gun, there is nothing you can do as a student to escape. If someone attacks with a knife, perhaps you can save a few young people."

When I think to myself, many Samurai have lived in a more dangerous environment. It resulted in a more intensive Budo practice and vigilance. That meant that surely they were not nervous, scared, or of violent character. On the other hand, they were not allowed to be careless and overly carefree. Thus, they probably tried to always be prepared for death in order to remain calm, but at same time they were vigilant in order to not only protect themselves, but to assist those who needed help. Perhaps now we are approaching such an "exciting" time and situation. The time in which, in our peaceful and pampered life, we are forced to deal with death; although, in view of our short life, this should always be the case. Let us, therefore, be vigilant. This fits very well with Budo practice.

Therefore, those who would like to order should first enter Shinkiryu - regardless that the rule states that the entry must be made one year before the Shoden exam at the latest.

State Garden Show is, now, far more than a mere event for application and development of the regional landscape. Rather, it is a representation of the entire area with its culture and people. Our club (TSV Waldbach) had, therefore, on June 11, the opportunity to present itself and its departments. In addition to our Judo and Keysi Section, we also had the opportunity to introduce ourselves.

Unfortunately, the conflicting schedule prevented our two instructors from attending. So the event was already regarded as not feasible. In order to react and still attend the event, I asked neighboring dojo instructors whether they wanted to represent not only our dojo in Waldbach, but represent us under the "Banner" of the Shinki Rengo Association. Two dojo instructors contacted me.







On Saturday afternoon we were able to provide a demonstration with 10 Aikidoka outdoors, in the sunshine. After a short warm-up, Bernd Hubl and Heike Fischer gave the interested public an insight into Shinki Toho with a display of the first 11 forms of the Kumidachi. Under the supervision of Bernd and Petra Hubl and Matthias Böttcher, different techniques and explanations to the basic principles of Aikido were shown. The day ended with an Aikitaiso breathing exercise that included audience participation.

I am pleased to report on how well the cooperation between different dojo's can work. My special thanks go to the dedicated groups and instructors from Wiesbaden and Pforzheim.

etween Not-knowing (Emptiness, Leere) and knowing (the Teaching, Lehre) lies knowledge, said a medical assistant. The sentence excited me. Seminars facilitate knowledge in a richly filled void.
